Professor Angel Lopez is Director of the Centre for Cancer Biology in Adelaide and Head of the Cytokine Receptor Laboratory. He holds an MD from the University of Rosario, Argentina; a PhD from the University of London, UK, and is a Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia. He has worked for over 30 years on the structure and function of cytokine receptors and their mechanism of action in health and disease. He leads a team of hard working and enthusiastic investigators internationally recognized for its insights into the βc cytokine family, new paradigms in understanding how βc receptors signal, and for the development of new potential therapeutics for the treatment of certain types of leukaemia and inflammatory diseases. He was elected a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science in 2014 and in 2015 elected a fellow of the Australian Academy of Health and Medical Sciences.
